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I mean if you have a wireless card then you have the adapter, the real transmitter that plugs into a computer. why should we buy a wireless card if we can get the adapter to just plug into the computer? there is no reason why it should be so complicated. Open source has only really been mainstream now for a few years and one of the major problems I see with this is that there are just too many different types of computers. I think that a standard should be created like there are with TV standards, NTSC/PAL/SECAM and so on, so that not only can people who have bought TVs and/or cameras hook them up to their computers via VGA or component (at least in theory), but also things like mobile devices (iphones/pads/etc) and android tablets. If we can do this with TVs and cameras, why can't we do the same with laptops/mobiles/tablets? I think one thing that would help is if laptops came with a physical adapter and not just an on-board one, but if the adapter was a USB, that would be ideal. Why are people always giving up on software, if the manufacturer couldn't make it work, wouldn't they just change the software to work in the first place? I think the problem is that they can't just fix it in one of their own products, they have to get an external party to do it for them. Perhaps the more trouble they make for themselves the more likely they are to go external? I think it's more about branding. When I was a kid (in the 70s, I started first using consumer-grade computers in 1985) I found the personal computer an extremely friendly, uncomplicated machine. A friend of mine has a computer now from around 1990 and it's still an extremely friendly, uncomplicated machine. When the personal computer started to get off the ground, it was mostly a business tool. The business community is an extremely conservative group. If you make a product, they need to be sure it's going to be around for a while. I don't think they're ever going to jump on board with releasing the source code, because that would completely change their business model. It's really up to the manufacturers and vendors to get the source code released. If they don't, then that's a failure of the marketplace. As a side note, I remember when I was 82157476af

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
